Unfortunately for Boris's 5s a fantastic season came up one week short as they ran into a white hot GGCD in round two of the finals. A fantastic season nonetheless as that team reinforced with some players coming in from the reduced team model from last season helping their depth.

Division 6 was our only multiple team Division for this season and both teams were neck and neck for the entire season. CJ's squad pulling away as the season neared finals. Communications Manager's Report

This was my first season as part of the board and in the role of Communications Manager.

Facebook engagement has continued to grow, over 100 new page likes since I took more responsibility for the page (August 2018), we are sitting at 1871 page likes. I have tried to create a cohesive aesthetic for the page and also across Instagram.

As I am a member of the Women's team I found it most easy to post a lot of content from women's games and events. I have made several requests from other teams to get more content but unfortunately not a lot was given and I felt like I was constantly chasing people for info. This is an area I definitely want to focus on for next season to ensure engagement across all teams. Ideally I would like to have updates on each day of the weekend and imagery is a fantastic tool, especially in Instagram. I made an effort to attend events that I otherwise would not have attended just to try and get images and anecdotes to share with our members; I tried to make sure that I added as much of this content as possible and have stored away several photos for future posts.

Comments made on Facebook and Instagram posts were nearly all positive and reflected well on our club. I did remove 2 Facebook comments made by members early in the summer season but this was followed up with positive email communication. Understandably the highest engagements were with Presentation Night posts, Premiership posts and award winners as well as the "Get to know the Board" posts, again though not all board members participated in this request.

I created a new Instagram page in August 2018 that has followers from local, interstate and international groups as well as individuals. GBC members seem to interact with this page almost as much as the Facebook page, so far we have 313 followers and 114 posts (plus stories). I have been tagging baseball related brands, companies that we buy from, sponsors and members to create further engagement. We have recently had communication with Louisville Slugger who have offered to replace a broken bat with an MLB model. Companies have been reacting and reposting our content which has led to more engagement and recognition for the GBC brand.

I look forward to continuing to build on our Social Media Presence.



Women's Development Manager Report

The 2018-19 season marked the third season of Women's Baseball in Adelaide. This year, the Women's Baseball League moved to having both Division 1 and Division 2 for the first time. This season demonstrated a marked improvement in player skill development and game knowledge, evidenced in both teams making it to the Grand Final (after last season where neither of our Women's teams placed highly enough in the ladder to make the finals). All players maintained a consistent commitment to learning more about the game itself and developed markedly improved skills in batting and fielding. This was a critical aspect of both teams' success in the 2018-19 season.

This year's Grand Final serendipitously fell on International Women's Day. Division 1 were challenged by a strong Sturt Saints team throughout the Grand Final game and finished in 2nd place. Division 2 fought back against the Adelaide Angels, chipping away at an initial 5 run deficit to secure the Grand Final win by 1 run and taking the flag for this season in a nail-biting. Both teams represent a historic first Grand Final appearance for any Women's baseball teams at GBC, thus also making the Division 2 win all the more relevant as part of our club's history.

Furthermore, this season marked the first time that the Baseball League was also inclusive of two Under 15 Girls charter teams. Long-time GBC player and supporter Georgia Davis was part of this league and went on to make the State team for Victoria as a friendship player, securing a bronze medal at Nationals (currently South Australia does not have a Girl's Baseball representative team). These youth teams will continue to contribute vital opportunities for young girls to transition into Women's Baseball in years to come.

We were fortunate enough to have four GBC representatives in the annual "East vs West" All-Star Game (Bianca Smith, Jenna Handy, Alice Prokopec, Jenny Dunn). While our West team didn't secure a win, this annual event was a fantastic opportunity for players from all clubs within the Women's League to watch some high-quality baseball and develop a strong and inclusive community culture. All clubs turned up in large numbers to support their team mates who were playing, an event not to be missed next season!

We were also fortunate enough to have three representatives in the South Australian Women's State Baseball team (Bianca Smith, Alice Prokopec, Jenny Dunn). These players contributed to the strength of the State team, managing to secure a bronze medal at the cessation of their competition. To further this success, Alice Prokopec managed to win the Division 1 Capps Medal (MVP) for the Women's League at the closure of the 2018-19 season. I'd also like to acknowledge Bianca Smith and Alex Meldrum who made the Top 10 highest votes list in Division 1 and Division 2 respectively for the Capps Medal.

Our end of season feedback was extremely positive, indicating that there is a significant level of enjoyment and acknowledgement of support in being a player at GBC. Season highlights for most players obviously included our historic Grand Final appearances in both divisions. However, I was most proud to read that for many, it was the sense of camaraderie and belonging to team of women who intentionally built each other up throughout the season that made their time and efforts worthwhile. Thank you and congratulations to all of the 2018-19 players, coaches, volunteers and supporters of the Women's League who helped to make this season our most successful season thus far. We have a strong foundation to build upon for our next season – here's to 2019-20!

Regular Season Summary

After a first-round bye (Due to Woodville not having a Div 3 team), opening day for us was away at Port Adelaide. Star junior Flynn Luders started on the hill and gave us a quality start and - despite a late comeback - we ended up going down to the Magpies 7-4.

Flynn would go on and give us another 4 starts (all before Christmas) before we lost him for the season to Division 1 and 2. A complete game shut-out against local foe West Torrens (a 5-0 win on Remembrance Day) was a dominant outing against quality opposition and effectively ended Flynn's Division 3 season.

The club recruited emerging flamethrower Will Burke to the club (from Southern Districts) and - along with veteran Craig Handy – the 2 big righties shouldered the majority of the pitching load for the remainder of the regular season with great success and poise.
