For continuous and passionate impact on South Australian Baseball through excellence in Playing, Coaching & Baseball Administration

A distinguished career, Greg is only the second player to win 5 Capps Medals, joining fellow ABF Hall of Famer, Don Rice, and the only player to win multiple medals at 2 clubs.

Greg's Division 1 career started in 1976 at Sturt but the following year transferred to Glenelg and formed a formidable battery pitching to fellow ABF Hall of Famer, Phil Alexander.

Greg transferred to Goodwood in 1986 as Playing/Coach for 4 years and after 4 years at Southern Districts Greg returned to Glenelg and coached in the junior grades, spent more time on the Management Committee, including 3 years as President.
