Personally, the role has been a bit of a struggle this season, so thank you to those of you who have been patient, understanding and most importantly supportive. Key achievements in financial management include:

- 21/22 accounts audited by Accru Harris (refer financial reports).
- 22/23 submitted to Accru Harris for audit before AGM (refer financial reports).
- All bank and credit card transactions now successfully managed in Xero with supporting documentation.
- Pricing and product review of all drinks completed in September 2022.
- Alumni funds isolated into separate bank account.

- Set budgets and report actuals against budget for each portfolio regularly.
- Review pricing of all items sold (canteen and bar) before start of season because of cost increases. Simplify products and suppliers, minimise wastage, and standardise profit margins.

Rookie Ball

The Rookie Ball initiative turned from Pilot Program (March) into our Inaugural Season later in August/September 2022 riding on the back of the success of the Pilot Program.

The plan is to build on this in the lead up to the new season each year. Targeting 5-10 year old's, that we hope translates into GBC Pee Wee/Minor Leaguer's. A special shout out to the GBC players that were part of the coaching team. The program was hindered by a few factors - notably lighting and rain, but it was a fantastic turn out over the 6 weeks the program ran for.




Player Milestone's



Stepping into the women's Div 1 space this year was certainly a challenge. We come off the result of back-to-back premiers under former coach Craig Handy who had to date done a terrific job with a great bunch of women, it was always going to be tough as the level in the competition and the women's game continues to grow and be fierce.

This year was no exception to that being our starter for the year basically and us having huge reliance on her ability and performance. Well done B for getting it done especially with the added pressure of knowing we rely on you heavily.

Georgia Kaluza this year became a solid part of the Div 1 starting line up. Georgia helped out in various positions throughout the season and became a vital part of our Div one team. Even got a new nose for the cause.

Ezzy Harris had a go for part of the season, foregoing her usual CF gig as we let Kenzie find her feet and I am grateful for her commitment, attitude, stellar performance as always and that she just does what the team needs. Again- not something I have not noticed and am not grateful for. Another great year for Erin both defensively in the outfield, when filling in at first base and with the bat with another solid game in finals offensively when it counts. Congrats as well on your 50 game cap achieved this season.

Another who you cannot fault in commitment and skill and really has been such an underrated player over the years in what she puts in, her technical ability and her ability to put her body and everything she has on the line is Jenna Handy. A big Thankyou to Shelley for being our manager. The tough job of organising bar and shop and for dealing with me on the bench. Definitely kept me on my toes and I really appreciate it.

Another season done and dusted ladies. Probably not our strongest or our best if we are honest and it has come with many hurdles in its commitment, injuries, illness and cohesion but still some great baseball from a group of women that have proven premierships are something they are capable of. I hope next year gets you back up on top and wish you every success in your future baseball careers.

As well as the management responsibilities John helped out when the club held many Australian Championships, especially in the 80' & '90 as well as all the Country Championships.

In 1990 John was awarded Life Members for "Service to the Club as a member, working for the club in the social and fundraising aspects of the club and for continuing work on the maintenance of Club's facilities especially the ground for over 20 years."

In 2019 John was – Awarded Life time Achievement Award – for 50 years' service to the Glenelg Baseball Club.

A true legend on the Glenelg Baseball Club, respected in everything he did on and off the field, on and away from the club, and one of the nicest guys you could ever meet.




Vale' - Desmond Eldridge
